























This is a portrait of Gonfederate soldier, James H. Cannichael, son of John Hudson Cannichael. John was the original builder of the Cannichael Inn circa 1800/1810. Sons James and Dun helped operate the Inn in addition to a feny and suggeooch. After the Civil War, James and wife, Mary Janet (Rafesdale) Carmichael left the Inn and naised their family of five on a nearby farm adjacent to the river.
